Harold James (Jim) Hall Jr. died peacefully in his sleep following a short illness, in Sun City West, AZ, surrounded by his family on February 12, 2017. He was 83 years old.

Over the years they enjoyed summers at a beach cottage, winters skiing in northern Michigan and Colorado and many memorable vacations traveling across the country to visit national parks and monuments and the Spokane World Fair. He taught his children to be self sufficient, loving, caring and considerate of others by his actions throughout his life.
